

The following pages from *Luah Hashanah 5780* describe home rituals and prayer services to help you prepare for and experience a meaningful Shavu'ot.

The instructions for prayer services apply to those praying with a minyan.

If you are praying *without* a minyan, omit all instances of:

- קדיש Kaddish
- ברכו Barekhu and response
- קדושה Kedushah
- Repetition of the Amidah
- Torah Service

Instead, read the designated Torah and haftarah selections from a *humash* or other resource, *without* reciting *berakhot* (blessings).

May we all experience a safe and joyous holiday in these unprecedented times, as we commemorate the gift of Torah to the people Israel.

Shavu'ot

Before Shavu'ot

Preparing an Eruv Tavshilin

When Yom Tov falls on a weekday, cooking is permitted, but only to prepare food for that particular day. On Shabbat all cooking is forbidden. Therefore, preparing food for a Shabbat that follows a Friday Yom Tov presents a difficulty.

To allow cooking for Shabbat on the preceding Friday Yom Tov:

On Thursday before Yom Tov, perform the ritual of **עֲרוּב תַבְשִׁילִין** *eruv tavshilin*, the combining (**עֲרוּב** *eruv*) of the cooking for Yom Tov and Shabbat.

Start the Shabbat cooking Thursday afternoon, following this procedure:

1. Before Yom Tov begins, take two prepared foods, customarily a baked food (e.g., **חֲלֵה** *hallah*) and a cooked food (e.g., a hard-cooked egg or a piece of cooked chicken or fish).
2. Recite the **בְּרָכָה** *berakhah*: ^{L78} ^{S306} ^{F716}

3. In a language you understand, recite a declaration that cooking for Shabbat was begun before—and will be completed on—Yom Tov. ^{L78} ^{S306} ^{F716}

בְּעֲרוּב הַזֶּה יְהִי מֵתָר לָנוּ לְאִפּוֹת וּלְבִשָׁל וּלְהַטְמִין,

לָנוּ וּלְכָל-יִשְׂרָאֵל הַדְּרִים בְּעִיר הַזֹּאת.

By means of this combining (*eruv*), we are permitted to bake, cook, warm, kindle lights, and make all the necessary preparations for Shabbat during the festival (*yom tov*), we and all who live in this city/locale.

4. Set aside the two foods for eating on Shabbat during the day. The cooking for Shabbat may now be completed on Yom Tov.

Preparing a Flame for Yom Tov

On Yom Tov, kindling a *new* fire is not permitted; however, the use of an *existing* fire for cooking or other purposes is permitted.

To light candles for Shabbat and Day 2 of Yom Tov (Friday night), ensure you have a fire burning before candle-lighting time for Day 1 (Thursday evening) that will continue to burn until Shabbat candle-lighting time. For example:

- A burning candle that lasts for more than 25 hours
- A pilot light on a gas range (*not* a gas range with an electronic starter)

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Shavu'ot — Day 1 and Day 2

Arvit — Day 1: Completing 7 Full Weeks of the Omer

On the first night, begin Arvit—or time its start so that you reach its עמידה *amidah*—only after dark (at least 25 minutes after sunset). Some delay until after dark only קידוש *kiddush* at home and the Yom Tov meal. Nevertheless, light candles before sunset.

Candle Lighting for Yom Tov — Day 1

1. Before lighting candles, prepare a flame. See p. 167.
2. Light the candles at least 18 minutes before sunset.
3. Recite 2 ברכות *berachot* (both nights): ^{L79 S303 F718}

Enjoy festive meals evening and afternoon, in the manner of Shabbat meals, with:

- Yom Tov קידוש *kiddush* (Day 2: with Shabbat additions):

- *hamotsi* recited over 2 whole חלה *hallah* loaves or rolls ^{L81 S313-14 F744|746}

Meals consisting of dairy foods are customary on Shavu'ot. Some follow this practice only for the first day of Shavu'ot.

Tikkun Levl Shavu'ot

On the first night, some follow the kabbalistic tradition of participating in a תיקון ליל שבועות *tikkun levl shavu'ot*, a night of Torah study, to thoroughly prepare for reliving God's revelation at Sinai during the morning Torah service.

Candle Lighting for Shabbat and Yom Tov — Day 2

At least 18 minutes before sunset, follow this procedure:

1. Do not *strike* a match. Instead, transfer fire to the candles from an *existing* flame (see p. 167) by inserting a match or other stick into the flame.
2. Do not *extinguish* the match or stick. Instead, place it on a non-flammable tray or dish, and let it self-extinguish. Alternately, a wood *safety* match held vertically (flame up) usually self-extinguishes quickly.
